MAY WE ALL BE INSCRIBED

"This is a *true story*. I've been a lifelong member of Shearith Israel. Shearith has been a part of my daily life and all my family's special lifecycle events. But, about eleven years ago, I felt a void. I wanted a deeper connection to Judaism, so I joined Shearith's Adult B'nei Mitzvah class. I knew I'd learn (or re-learn) about davening and prayer, but I hadn't realized how much it would reinvigorate my joy in attending services. The haftorah we learned in class was the very haftorah from my bar mitzvah, so I guess it was *B'shert*—meant to be.

Last year, when everything closed down because of COVID, I watched as our community grew even closer through daily online minyans, Shabbat services, and wonderful classes and programs. I saw how much comfort we all took from each other. I learned from *Avi Mitzner's* twice weekly class after morning minyans and *Rabbi Adam Roffman's* Thursday afternoon classes.

Then, in spite of everything, Shearith grew stronger! We've accomplished so much in the past year under *Rabbi Ari Sunshine*'s leadership. Our Weitzman Family Religious School grew to over 100 students. Our Social Action committee innovated several new opportunities to help both the Dallas and Jewish communities. *Rabbi Shira Wallach* guided our youngest members and their families, helping them stay connected during this challenging time.

Hazzan Itzhak Zhrebker lifted us in song. And Kim West, along with our administration, Board of Directors, and our Foundation worked diligently to ensure our financial stability.

When we began gathering again this past summer, I was struck that each Shabbat morning when I'd see a new face at shul, our members always went over and introduced themselves and welcomed every single newcomer.

For all these reasons, Shearith is my home and my family. And, with all that Shearith has given me and our community, I'm so proud to be able to give back. And that, unlike the tall tales I tell during Shabbat Announcements, actually is a true story!"

"After my father passed away I began attending

evening Minyan services. Because it was my first experience with "true" mourning, I didn't know what to expect. I learned there's a 7-day shiva period, a 30-day shloshim period, and an 11-month period of reciting the mourner's kaddish. I found the minyan experience to be educational and healing. I grew up at Shearith and my daughters each had their b'nei mitzvah at Shearith, so I immediately saw some familiar faces. Avi Mitzner, Cantor Z, Alan Sandgarten, and Cary Rudberg, to name a few. Over the months other mourners joined us and we became each other's support system and good friends. Each month David Karlebach organized monthly social, minyan dinners.

Surprisingly, the 11 months went faster than I expected. Because of that, and my new friends, I continue coming to evening minyan services—maybe not as frequently. I also come because it's a mitzvah and to show my support for more recent mourners and those observing yahrzeits, so they will have enough people to say kaddish. Now, I'm inviting you to come, you'll help someone else, and who knows, you may even help yourself in the process. If you decide to come to evening minyan and you see a tall, bald-headed and bearded fella, come on over and introduce yourself."



"Women's Torah Study has provided an amazing opportunity to study with a group of women and have a female rabbi, Rabbi Shira Wallach, serve as our facilitator and teacher. I am always blown away by the depth of knowledge, brutal honesty and deep thinking that emanates from this group. "Mitzvah Meals began in 2009,

when I received a call, asking me to help organize meal delivery to an ill congregant. From there, the Mitzvah Meals Program began and grew. As of today, we have delivered well over 700 meals and good cheer to Shearith Israel congregants who have medical conditions that required hospitalization or who have special needs at home. Either the klei kodesh or a fellow congregant lets me know of someone who would benefit from receiving meals. I set the schedule and work out dietary restrictions. Then, working with my volunteers, we schedule meal delivery. I'm fortunate to be able to have a part in the mitzvot of bikkur cholim. visiting the sick, and of gemilut chasadim, performing acts of loving kindness. By helping in a small way, the Mitzvah Meals volunteers let our congregants and those caring for them, know that we care. I can't think of a more powerful message we can send to those who are ill."

"What can \$1000 buy? Twice as much as expected! A couple months ago at a Social Action meeting, co-chairs *Mindy Fagin* and *Andrea Solka* mentioned an organization,

Pajamas for Seniors started by a hospice nurse. The nurse had

noticed a lot of patients had nothing to wear besides a hospital gown and for their dignity and comfort she wanted patients to have pajamas. When the program had been in place for a while, she found that she desperately needed men's pajamas, especially in extra-large sizes. The Shearith Social Action budget had \$1000 to put toward this project. In researching pajamas, I found a great deal on large sizes on Hanes.com, with a coupon and a special sale I was able to buy 80 pairs of pajamas. I wrote to Hanes and told them our story and Hanes matched us, donating an additional 80 pairs! In July, along with Rabbi Adam Roffman and Andrea Solka. we delivered new PJs to the residents of Linden Park Rehab and celebrated Hanukkah (and Christmas) in July!




