HIGH HOLY DAYS AT CONGREGATION SHEARITH ISRAEL

The clergy, staff, and Board of Directors of Congregation Shearith Israel are working hard to ensure that the 5772 High Holy Days services are meaningful to you and your family.

Our goal is to make this year's High Holy Days as worry-free as possible. We have listed some guidelines to help you through the season.

TICKETS/SEATS

Tickets will be issued to members in good standing; that is, to members who have fulfilled all their financial obligations to CSI through fiscal 2011 (July 1, 2010-June 30, 2011). If you are having trouble bringing your account to a good standing you may contact our Accounts Receivable Committee who will help you to make alternative arrangements.

We will issue only one ticket per individual; all tickets must have the name of the seat holder on them for security.

Tickets are not transferable.

Please present your ticket to the security officers and ushers when you arrive.

Your patience is greatly appreciated with our security officers and ushers. Our security officers and ushers may not know all of our members, so if one of them stops you, please understand that he/she is working to ensure your safety and the well-being of all our members.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS AND NON-MEMBERS

After August 26, seats will become available to associate members and non-members. The cost of an associate member or non-member ticket will be an additional 25% of the cost of a member.

DOUGLAS CAMPUS

Seats in all locations are assigned.

We will have ushers available to help you find your seat. Please show your ticket to the ushers.

BEIT ARYEH

Seating is on a first-come, first-served basis.

We will have ushers available to help you find a seat.

No one who has resigned from CSI during the past three years is eligible to purchase a ticket.

Non-members may purchase tickets for a maximum of three years.

We welcome local college students and military personnel to our synagogue and have complimentary tickets available at the Help Desk. To get a complimentary ticket, go to one of the Help Desks and present a current student or military ID and a second form of picture ID.

HELP DESKS

Douglas

Help Desks will be located outside the Beck Family Sanctuary and at the west entrance.

Beit Aryeh

The Help Desk will be located at the main entrance.

There will be CSI staff at both locations to assist you if you have forgotten or misplaced your ticket.

ENTRANCE TO BUILDINGS

Douglas

If your seats are in the Aaron Family Sanctuary, please enter through the west or south doors.

If your seats are in the Beck Family Sanctuary, please enter through the north doors.

Beit Aryeh

Please enter through the entrance that faces Frankford Road.

PARKING AT THE DOUGLAS CAMPUS

Please park in the south or west lots if your seats are in the Aaron Family Sanctuary.

Please park in the north lot if your seats are in the Beck Family Sanctuary.

Offsite parking will be available at the Fifth Church of Christ Scientist parking lot, located at 5655 West Northwest Highway, Dallas 75220.

MAHZORIM

The prayer book Mahzor Hadash will be used for all High Holy Days services. We are pleased to make mahzorim available to all our members.

CHILDREN

In order to provide a safe, comfortable and prayerful environment for all of our congregants, we STRONGLY recommend enrolling your children in our age-appropriate programming.

Babysitting for ages 18 months to five years is available in a babysitting room. **Mandatory Registration** is required by Friday, August 26; we regret we will not be able to accommodate walk-ins. The cost for babysitting is \$5 per child with a maximum of \$15 per family.

Youth programming for K-6 will be held on Rosh Hashanah Day 1 and 2, Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur. Programming options for 7-12 grades will be available on these days as well.

This year we are beginning a new mentoring program where teens in grades 9 through 12 may apply to be volunteer helpers with the children's programming.

If you choose to take your child to one of our services and need a break, we will provide a space for you and your child where we will make toys and games available. Please note that this is not a drop-off childcare room; it will not be staffed.

OUT OF RESPECT FOR YOUR FELLOW MEMBERS...

Smoking is not allowed on the CSI premises. (building or grounds)

Please do not talk or text on your cell phone while in the building. If you have an emergency and must use your cell phone, please step outside or ask for assistance at one of the help desks. We ask that you silence your cell phones.

Please remind your child that the use of cell phones is prohibited on Shabbat and Holy Days.

LETTER FROM CSI PRESIDENT, SHARON K. LEVIN

I hope this letter finds you and your family well and enjoying the summer season. The High Holy Days will be here shortly and we want to share some information with you. One of the things we are most proud of in our shul is the way in which we provide the best service to our congregants. We provide three very different types of religious services so that every member's needs should be met. In this booklet, you will find an outline of programs and services which Congregation Shearith Israel will be offering for the 2011/5772 High Holy Days.

This year you will not need a ticket for Erev Rosh Hashanah services. We will have open seating as usual. Please invite your families, friends and the community to join us for this family-friendly service. Please look for more details in the Shofar and on our web page www.shearith.org.

Our services will be in the Aaron Family Main Sanctuary and Beck Family Sanctuary on the Douglas Campus, and in Beit Aryeh on the Ann and Nate Levine Academy Campus: **Erev Rosh Hashanah, Wednesday, September 28th; Rosh Hashanah Thursday, September 29th and Friday, September 30th; Kol Nidre, Friday, October 7th; and Yom Kippur Saturday, October 8th. As in the past, seats in the Aaron Family Main Sanctuary and in Beck Family Sanctuary are assigned; at Beit Aryeh there is no assigned seating. Reservations and tickets are required for admission to all services with the exception of Erev Rosh Hashanah. To continue to provide a safe place of worship for our congregants, we will continue our policy of issuing tickets for each individual seat. Every person who enters the building will be required to show his or her own ticket and photo identification for entry. Please carry your ticket and photo identification with you at all times. Thank you.**

Once again, we will have offsite parking available at the Fifth Church of Christ Scientist parking lot located at 5655 West Northwest Highway, Dallas, Texas 75220. We will have shuttle buses available to transport you to and from Shearith Israel on Douglas Avenue.

Please check the enclosed seating price schedule before requesting the seats of your choice. We are committed to making certain that every congregant can participate here at Congregation Shearith Israel. Should you need any financial assistance in this matter, please do not hesitate to speak with Robin Littrell at ext. 210.

Again this year, we have designed a Rabbinic High Holy Days "round-robin" (see page 8). Rabbi Gershon will officiate at all three locations so he is able to spend part of the holidays with all of our congregants. Rabbi Glickman will officiate at Beit Aryeh and Rabbi Menashe will return again this year to officiate at our Douglas site.

Cantors officiating at the three services are as follows: Cantor Itzhak Zhrebker, accompanied by the Congregation Shearith Israel Choir, will co-officiate in the Aaron Family Main Sanctuary; Cantor Mark Levine and Ritual Director, Avi Mitzner will alternate in Beck Family Sanctuary and at Beit Aryeh.

There are a number of other items to review this year:

- First, thanks to the hard work of our budget committee. I am happy to say that there is no fee increase for High Holy Day seats this year. It was the commitment of the synagogue's leadership that seat prices be kept stable to insure that all of our congregants can enjoy the holidays.
- Second, in an effort to create a unique family prayer experience, services on Erev Rosh Hashanah in the Aaron Family Main Sanctuary and at Beit Aryeh will be opened up to include family of our members and guests who belong to other synagogues in the community.
- We are very excited to offer another special Family Service on the second day of Rosh Hashanah again this year. While this service will be geared for families and children, everyone is welcome to participate and enjoy the experience. The service, approximately one hour in length will be led by Rabbi Gershon in Topletz Auditorium.

- Rabbis Menashe and Glickman will be leading special Tashlich services on the first day of Rosh Hashanah, Thursday, September 29th. In the North, services will be held at Frankford Park while in the south, the community will have the pleasure of participating in Tashlich at the home of Susan and Marty Golman, 5847 Dexter Drive, Dallas, TX 75230. Especially geared for young families, this service will give parents and grandparents an opportunity to engage their children and/or grandchildren in the Holy Day tradition. For more details on Tashlich, please see page 6 of this book.
- We will also once again be offering babysitting and children's activities for youngsters, 18 months to five years. **Due to code compliance and regulations there is a specific ratio of the number of children to babysitter. All children must be pre-registered this year. There is a nominal fee for babysitting to help us provide the safest environment for your children. Please see page 14 to register your children.** Children's programming will be held on the morning of the first and second day of Rosh Hashanah, Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur. However, if you have guests joining you to worship at Congregation Shearith Israel, they will need to register their children as well by calling our Religious School prior to the beginning of the holidays.
- We have also taken special note of the concerns that our congregants have raised regarding our High Holy Day youth programs. This year we have completely redesigned the youth programs and are utilizing a variety of different modes to teach our children about Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur and enrich their experience of the holidays. Programming this year will include such activities as: age-appropriate services, story telling, holiday games, and guest teachers. Everyone at Congregation Shearith Israel shares the belief in the importance of a positive and valued youth experience throughout this most meaningful time of the year.
- Additionally, this year we are beginning a new mentoring program where teens in grades 9 through 12 may apply to be volunteer helpers with the children's programming. To apply, go to page 16.
- This packet includes your seating request form, as well as a statement of policies and procedures for your information. Please read it carefully before making your 2011 seat requests. As in the past, eligibility to order seats requires that your synagogue account be current. We date each request form so that seating is done equitably. By returning your form prior to the deadline date of Friday, August 26, 2011 you have the best opportunity to receive the seats of your choice. We will begin mailing your seat tickets on Monday, September 12th, two weeks prior to Rosh Hashanah. You may use your Visa or MasterCard for payment. Starting in July, for your convenience, our ticket office will be open Monday through Friday from 10:00 am until 3:00 p.m. The office will be open until 8:00 pm on Wednesday, August 24th. Please note the synagogue office will be closed on Wednesday, September 28th so that our employees may prepare for the holiday.

This is a very exciting time for Congregation Shearith Israel. We continue to carry on the vision of our shul which is to meet the spiritual needs of all our families. We want you to pray in an environment that best suits you. I urge you to fill out your forms and return them as quickly as possible so we can provide you with the seating of your choice. Please contact us if you have any questions or concerns. We are here to serve you and your family.

These home rituals help families connect with one another, to the Jewish people, and to God. Our holiday evening rituals and their associated blessings are given here in the order in which they are performed.

Candle-lighting Blessings

For both nights of Rosh Hashanah, first two nights of Sukkot, Erev Shemini Atzeret, and Erev Simchat Torah. (On Shabbat, we add the words in brackets).

Ritual Handwashing

As a symbolic gesture connecting our holiday table to the Tabernacle of Temple times, we wash our hands as did the Cohanim (high priests) before offering sacrifices. Using a full cup of water, we first pour water three times on our right hand then three times on our left hand, after which we recite the following:

Challah

From Rosh Hashanah through Simchat Torah, it is customary to eat round challah rather than oval or rectangular ones. We do so as a symbol of the continuation of life from one year to the next and as our hope for the New Year will bring with it a well-rounded, complete life undisturbed by tragedy.

The shecheyanu is traditionally recited on the first night of each holiday, however since the Rabbis fixed the two days of Rosh Hashanah as one long day, and included the Shecheyanu on the second night as well. Therefore, the custom developed on the second night to eat a new fruit (such as figs, pomegranates, kiwi) or other fruit not eaten that year, offering the opportunity to recite the Shecheyanu. Most common of these fruits is the pomegranate, in hope that we may be as full of good deeds as the pomegranate is of seeds.



Apples and Honey for a Sweet New Year

As an expression of the wish for a sweet year, apples or challah are dipped in honey at the beginning of the Rosh Hashanah meal after reciting the following:

Pre-Registration & Check- In

In order to provide adequate staff and supplies, all children **MUST** be registered in advance. All children (ages 18 months – 12th grade) must be checked in by their parent/guardian at the Youth Desk. Every child will be given a wrist band that must be worn to insure that all security and allergy information is available at all times.

Babysitting

Ages 18 months - 5 years old

Babysitting will be available during all services. Please send the following items (clearly marked with your child's name) along with your child: diapers, baby wipes, change of clothing and any milk/formula. You may use the form on page 14 to register your child(ren) for babysitting.

Due to code compliance and regulation ratios of number of children to babysitter, all children MUST be pre-registered and we will be charging a nominal fee. This helps us to provide the safest environment for our children.

The cost for babysitting is \$5 per child with a maximum of \$15 per family. All babysitting must be pre-registered and pre-paid.

Behavioral Expectations

To ensure the quality of the youth programs, we ask you to review with

your child(ren) the standards and behavior appropriate to the High Holy Days. Our goal is to create an environment where all children will feel safe and comfortable and can have a meaningful High Holy Day experience – at the appropriate age level.

Children are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful manner. This includes behavior towards peers and staff as well as the treatment of the facility and any equipment or supplies. If a child's behavior is beyond the bounds of appropriate, parents will be notified and asked to remove their child(ren) from the program. The child(ren) will not be allowed to return to the program that day.

Please note: Children and teens are NOT allowed to wander the halls of the synagogue. Also, please express the importance of turning off your child(ren)'s cell phone and not using their phones inside the synagogue.

Room Assignments and Daily Schedules

Room assignments and daily schedules will be posted at the Youth Desk as well as throughout the building.

Snacks and Food

A light snack will be provided. If you would like your child(ren) to eat lunch each day or you want your child(ren) to eat a snack that you have provided, please make sure that the food you send is **NUT FREE AND VEGETARIAN/DAIRY**. Label the food clearly with your child's name. Snack and lunch should not be provided for anyone over Bar/Bat Mitzvah age on Yom Kippur.
