Kids' warmup:

Pesach Foods

On Pesach we eat matzah, lots and lots of matzah
 It's yummy in my tummy, lots and lots of matzah.
 Doot do do do doot do do

On Pesach we eat chicken, finger-lickin' chicken...
 On Pesach we eat matzah balls, rollin rollin rollin rollin matzah balls...
 On Pesach: gefilte fish, smelly in my belly gefilte fish...
 On Pesach we eat horseradish, hot hot hot hot horseradish...

Grownups' warmup:

A Passover Song (Sung to the tune of "These are a few of my favorite things")

Cleaning and cooking and so many dishes
 Out with the hametz, no pasta, no knishes
 Fish that's gefilted, horseradish that stings
 These are a few of our Passover things.

Matzoh and karpas and chopped up haroset
 Shankbones and Kiddish and Yiddish neuroses
 Tante who kvetches and uncle who sings
 These are a few of our Passover things.

Motzi and maror and trouble with Pharoahs
 Famines and locusts and slaves with wheelbarrows
 Matzoh balls floating and eggshells that cling
 These are a few of our Passover things.

When the plagues strike
 When the lice bite
 When we're feeling sad
 We simply remember our Passover things
 And then we don't feel so bad.

And what are our Passover things? **Seder signposts**, page 6 (to the tune of “My Clementine”)

Blessing our children (p. 5) and **Kadesh Kiddush #1** (p. 8)

Urchatz: wash hands without a blessing

Karpas: Dip a **spring vegetable** in salt water

Yachatz: **Break** the middle matzah, put half inside a special bag, and hide the **Afikomen**

Maggid: Telling the **Story**

Ha Lachma Anya (p. 12), **Four Questions** (p. 14), **Four Children** (p. 18)

We were slaves in Egypt:

Make a Matzah

Make a matzah flat, flat, flat

Halleluyah!

We have so much to celebrate! Even if God hadn't performed ALL the miracles in the Pesach story, it would have been enough.

Dayenu (p. 48)

Seder Plate Show-and-Tell: **Pesach, Matzah, and Maror** (p. 52-53)

Kiddush #2 (p. 58)

Rachtzah: wash your hands WITH a blessing (p. 59)

Motzi Matzah: say blessings over matzah and have a delicious crunchy bite! (p. 59)

Maror: take a piece of maror and dip it into charoset. Mmmm. (p. 60)

Korech: make a Hillel sandwich! Maror and charoset on matzah. Just needs some ketchup (p. 62)

Shulchan Orech: Time to EAT! YAY! Take a bathroom/diaper break and enjoy your delicious matzah ball soup, chicken, kugel, veggies, and whatever else your grownups have. Make sure to thank them! We'll resume in about 15-20 minutes. Before we come back, find the **Afikomen**!

Meal intermission-----

Tzafun: We can't finish the Seder without eating the **Afikomen!** Did you find it? (p. 63)

Don't Sit on the Afikomen (sung to the tune of "Glory, Glory Halleluyah")

Someone at every Seder breaks a Matza piece in two
And hides the Afikomen half –
A game for me and you
Find it, hold it ransom for the Seder isn't through
'till the Afikomen's gone.

Chorus:

Don't sit on the Afikomen.

Or the Meal will last all night

Kiddush #3: yum! (p. 67)

We open the door for **Eliyahu HaNavi**, Elijah the Prophet (p. 68) because we need his help! We offer him grape juice or wine in the special Elijah's cup.

*when it gets dark, count the first day of the Omer (p. 73)

It's time to SING!

Chad Gadya (p. 82)

Nirtzah: The conclusion! (p. 85) We did it!
