The Ladder Project

Meet David Corn

David is a 58-year-old resident of The Bridge, Dallas' 24-hour, downtown homeless facility. After 17 months of homelessness, David is about to move into his own studio apartment. Thanks to you – the members of Congregation Shearith Israel.

A unique, holistic approach to Homelessness

On September 18, during Kol Nidre services, Shearith Israel launched The Ladder Project, a pilot program that approaches the problem of chronic homelessness in a unique and holistic way. The Ladder Project empowers our 1,000 congregant families to lift one person at a time out of homelessness. As a congregation, we will take responsibility for this person financially and socially until he or she can accomplish self-sufficiency, however long that may take, so long as that person is making progress. During this time The Bridge will continue to provide caseworker services.

The Executive Committee, Jeff Hoppenstein, Larry Krasner, Marsha Lev, Laura Miller, Andrea Solka and Sally Wolfish, selected David to help first, with the hope and expectation that many others will follow

David's Story

David was born in Oak Cliff. His father worked at the local box factory for thirtyeight years. His mother, a homemaker, was the only true constant in David's life, supporting him with unconditional love. David graduated from Kimball High School in 1978. With no money for college or technical school, he began a lifetime of short-lived, dead-end jobs that, combined with unsuccessful personal relationships, found him returning to his parents' house again and again throughout his adult years.

In December 2011, David's life was shattered when his parents were in a car accident that killed his mother and left his father physically and cognitively injured. David became his father's full-time caregiver. The two men subsisted on David's father's pension of \$600 per month.



In November 2013 the police knocked on the door and arrested David for failing to appear in court for a child support case for his 15-year-son. David says he told the police that his father was alone and disabled and would not survive without someone to care for him. David's best friend is his Bridge caseworker, Paige Furst. David has learned from her that the path to self-sufficiency is "to get a job and keep it." David has followed this advice. After washing dishes at a bar in Deep Ellum, David moved to his current janitorial job at El Centro College in downtown Dallas. He earns \$9 an hour, some of which is automatically deducted from his paycheck to fulfill his court-ordered child-support obligation to his son Jordan, now 20.

Until now, David had little chance of making it on his own: his low hourly wage and high child support payments made saving money nearly impossible; an apartment – with utility bills, a security deposit, and furnishings to buy – was a remote dream. When the synagogue offered to help, David called it "a secret miracle."

"When you dream of a better life, what does it look like?"

David answered, "When I lay my head down on the pillow at night, I see myself waking up in the morning in my own bed, in my own home, showering and dressing in my own bathroom, walking into my own kitchen, making myself a cup of coffee, and going to work."

Together, we will make David's dream come true.

With no way to contact his father, since there was no landline at home, and no phone numbers memorized for his sister or other relatives, David was unable to help his father, or himself. David sat in jail for 110 days. No one visited him during that time. David says, upon his release, he found a cousin had moved his father out of their home and put the house on the market. Unable to hire a lawyer, David lost all legal rights to the home he grew up in. His father died within a year, in a nursing home. David lived temporarily with a neighbor, sleeping on his couch, then took a bus to The Bridge, where he has lived ever since. Congregant Michael Ochstein stepped forward as the first part of that miracle, agreeing to rent a \$705-a-month studio apartment to David with no security deposit, credit history, or rent history required. Additionally, Michael made a generous contribution to The Ladder Project of \$5,000. Although David's name is on the lease, Shearith has agreed to supplement David's income enough to cover his rent, utility bills, and public transportation until he can pay for all of it himself. David will attend a financial management class every Saturday morning in October and share his paystubs and expense receipts with the synagogue.

The Ladder Project cont You Can Help

Most importantly, we are looking for congregants who can **offer David a higher paying job** at a Living Wage of \$12 to \$15/ hour. This will be the key to his transition to self-sufficiency.

Let's start with \$36. Our goal is to get 100% of all Shearith Israel families to contribute to a Housing/Transportation Fund set up specifically for The Ladder Project. This money will go to help David and other homeless people who we will help in the future. All donations are charitable and tax-exempt. You can donate online or mail in a personal check, earmarked for The Ladder Project.

You can also **make in-kind donations and purchase items** to outfit David's apartment through a special registry on the synagogue's website

One other crucial opportunity is to give David a sense that people care that he succeeds. You can drive David to a Shabbat dinner at shul, take him for lunch or coffee on an evening or weekend, or just call him on the phone and say hello. Studies show that feeling isolated and lonely leads directly to homeless recidivism. Opportunities to meet with David are also on the website.

David looks forward to thanking congregants for their help in starting his new life.

May this be the start of a healthy and spiritually fulfilling New Year for us all!



More Social Action News

The Social Action Committee invites you to make a difference. We started off the New Year with our annual food drive to stock the pantry at JFS. Coming up is book drive followed by the construction and installation of a Little Free Library in West Dallas. You can drop off new and used books for children and adults at the Shearith reception desk. Construction on the Little Free Library starts mid-October. We will need help from our handy, and tool-owning congregants! Installation takes place at the West Dallas campus of Literacy Achieves, which is a non-profit organization dedicated to teaching English as a Second Language (ESL) to immigrants and refugees who are eager to contribute to the community. Literacy Achieves also provides an on-site day-care and preschool. The installation and dedication will take place one Sunday in November.

As we segue into colder weather, on Sunday, January 6, we will make sandwiches to feed hungry, homeless adults at the Austin Street Shelter. Last year we made over 1,900 sandwiches, but with your help we can break 2,000! We will also collect chips, fruit and water. Come February, we will celebrate our second annual Galantines' Event on Wednesday, February 13. Last year's event benefitted Support the Girls, a non-profit organization that provides feminine hygiene products, bras and panties to homeless women and girls. We collected 77 bras, 92 panties and over 1500 feminine hygiene products. Help us make this year's Galantines' event even more impactful!






