SECURING SHEARITH NOW AND FOR THE FUTURE



division and extreme weather to mass shootings and deep fakes. countless sources of insecurity exist today, and the Jewish community is obviously not immune to such forces. All the data suggest that violence is on the rise along with an upward trend in antise-

mitic incidents which, according to the Anti-Defamation League, are at the highest level since the 1970s.

Shearith wants its members and guests to feel secure about this amazing shul, and now is no time to rest on our laurels. We want this place of prayer to be an increasingly safe and stable institution. This applies to both our synagogue's physical security and financial future.

political On the physical front, we have taken multiple steps to shore up our security including the addition of:

- New entrance door cameras and intercoms
- 50 Stop the Bleed Kits
- Push bar on the exit gate of the sacred garden
- Security shades and safety handles on educational wing classrooms
- Walkie talkies in offices and classrooms across the property for emergency communication
- LED lights in the north parking lot
- Additional armed officer for the Weitzman Family **Religious School on Sundays**
- Two-factor authentication (2FA) for email and virtual private network (VPN) connections
- Enhanced SPAM filtering to reduce phishing attacks

My favorite service is Kabbalat Shabbat on Friday nights. It is a special collection of songs and prayers, including Yedid Nefesh, L'Cha Dodi, and several psalms.

What are psalms?

The word Psalms, (in Hebrew "Tehillim" or "praises") is derived from the Greek word (psalmoi), meaning "instrumental music". Psalm 29, for example, is a powerful hymn sung during the Kabbalat service and is a song of praise and a call to worship for the assembled congregation.

Another wonderful prayer service occasionally held on Saturday mornings is "Learn, Pray, Sing," and it is an hour of inspirational teaching about

The Hebrew verb for praying is lehitpalel; it is reflexive and understood to mean that the subject acts to judge or self-examine. The conclusion of the silent recitation of the Amidah contains a personal prayer that always resonates deeply with me: "My God, keep my tongue from evil, my lips from deceit. Help me ignore those who would slander me. Let me be humble before all. Open my heart to Your Torah, that I may pursue Your mitzvot. Frustrate the designs of those who plot evil against me; nullify their schemes. Act for the sake of Your name, act for the sake of Your triumph, act for the sake of Your holiness, act for the sake of Your Torah. Answer my prayer for the deliverance of Your people.



THE LADDER PROJECT



hat if you could help someone get out of homelessness in a unique and wholistic way – going a step beyond volunteering at a soup kitchen, writing a check to your favorite charity, or handing a \$5 bill to someone on the street corner?

What if you could meet someone living in a homeless shelter, learn about his or her life, find him a job and an apartment – and then, one morning, drive him

What if you could help someone out of homelessness?

from the shelter to his new home. filled with furniture, food, and everything needed to be comfortable and safe? And what if that person beself-sufficame

cient thanks to your continued efforts? How would that make you feel?

Your fellow Shearith Israel congregants know that feeling. They have been doing this work since 2018 through The Ladder Project, which has helped 30 men, women and children, in 15 different families, transition out of homelessness – 23 of whom are still living independently, many highly successfully.

The beauty of the program is that the nine members of the LP Executive Committee - and countless others who have contributed jobs, furniture, household

items, medical and dental services, financial advice, moving help, money - pitch in on their timetable, when they have the time, energy and inclination. The saying "It takes a village to raise a child" applies here: when you have 1,000 members of a synagogue, you have plenty of resources to save a life. Or 30.

Here is how you can help today:

• We need specific furniture items: small couches or loveseats; small end tables and coffee tables; small kitchen tables with 2-4 chairs; gueen (only)-sized beds (with nearly new, unstained mattresses); small clothing dressers; silverware, pots, pans, mixing bowls, pyrex dishes; floor lamps; TV stands.

• We need people to do computer searches for: affordable apartments; low-cost car and rental insurance; area food pantries; used cars; driver's license appointments; doctors; jobs.

• We need car rides in emergencies: doctor's appointments, job interviews, extended-stay motel check-ins, child-care pickups. (This is not frequent, and it's never dangerous: no volunteer has ever felt afraid or unsafe. ever).

• We need moving-day volunteers to drive a UHaul, carry clothing and furniture, shop with clients at Wal-Mart, and organize an apartment - assembling beds, hanging shower curtains, shelving dishware. The ultimate in satisfaction.

• We need car mechanics, optometrists, internists, therapists, dentists, lawyers.

• We need cash donations (of any size): go to the Ladder Project drop-down on the CSI donations page at www.shearith.org, or send a check to CSI, 9401 Douglas Ave., Dallas, TX 75225 and put "Ladder Project donation" on the check's memo line. (Donations are spent entirely on homeless clients - no overhead, no staff salaries, no waste.)



SHEARITH HISTORY ON DISPLAY




Congregation Shearith Israel has a rich, nearly 140 vear old history that has made us a steadfast and influential congregation in the Dallas Jewish Community.
